PRESS RELEASE – FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

On 5/11/2018 at 5:15 a.m., the Roseville Police were dispatched to the area of Chandler Ave. and Glenwood Ave. on a possible burglary. A resident reported they woke up and heard someone opening their front door and a male saying “Hello?” The male fled in an unknown direction. Around the same time, another resident in the 400 block of Glenwood Ave. reported just before officers arrived, they woke up and heard someone walking around in their house. The homeowner saw a dark figure with a flashlight. The suspect quickly exited the house.

As the morning progressed, officers received several other burglary and theft from auto reports in nearby neighborhoods. In one burglary in the 1700 block of Alameda Avenue, the suspects entered the residence and stole electronics, car keys and miscellaneous items. The suspects drove off in the resident’s two vehicles that were in the garage, a Chevrolet Silverado and a Cadillac SUV. A neighbor’s surveillance system captured three individuals arrive in the area on bikes at 2:00 a.m. The stolen vehicles were being driven off at 2:30 a.m.

Officers took a number of additional reports of attempted thefts, burglaries, and theft from autos in nearby neighborhoods. Officers are still investigating how suspects gained entry into the various residences and vehicles; however, in several of the cases, it appears the suspects found unsecured doors, windows, or vehicles. RPD’s Crime Scene Team processed several scenes and collected evidence to be submitted to the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension.


The Roseville Police Department is looking for the public’s help in locating any additional evidence related to the burglaries. Residents in the surrounding neighborhoods are encouraged to check their residence and vehicles. If you believe you have been a victim, please call 911 to file a report. If any residents have surveillance systems, we are asking them to please review May 11 recordings for any potential video that would assist identifying the suspects.

We urge the community to report any suspicious activity by calling 911 immediately. We also want to remind residents to:

- Lock All Doors and Windows.
 - Criminals can enter your home very easily and quietly if doors are left unlocked or windows are left open.
 - Don't forget to lock garage doors, service doors, patio doors, 3 season porch doors, and shed doors.
- Lock Car Doors.
 - Don't leave valuable items in cars.
 - Don't leave garage door openers in cars parked outside of the garage.
- Keep Your Lights On or Use Motion Sensor Lighting.
 - Criminals will choose houses where they are less likely to be seen or identified.
- Report Suspicious Activity.
 - If possible, get a good description of the person or vehicle, and note the direction of travel.
 - Report all in-progress activity to the police immediately.
- Get to Know Your Neighbors.
 - Connected neighborhoods are safer neighborhoods.
